Use these resources to help to enrich your student(s)' off-site learning experience. We understand this is a really hard time, but hope we've provided something worthwhile!

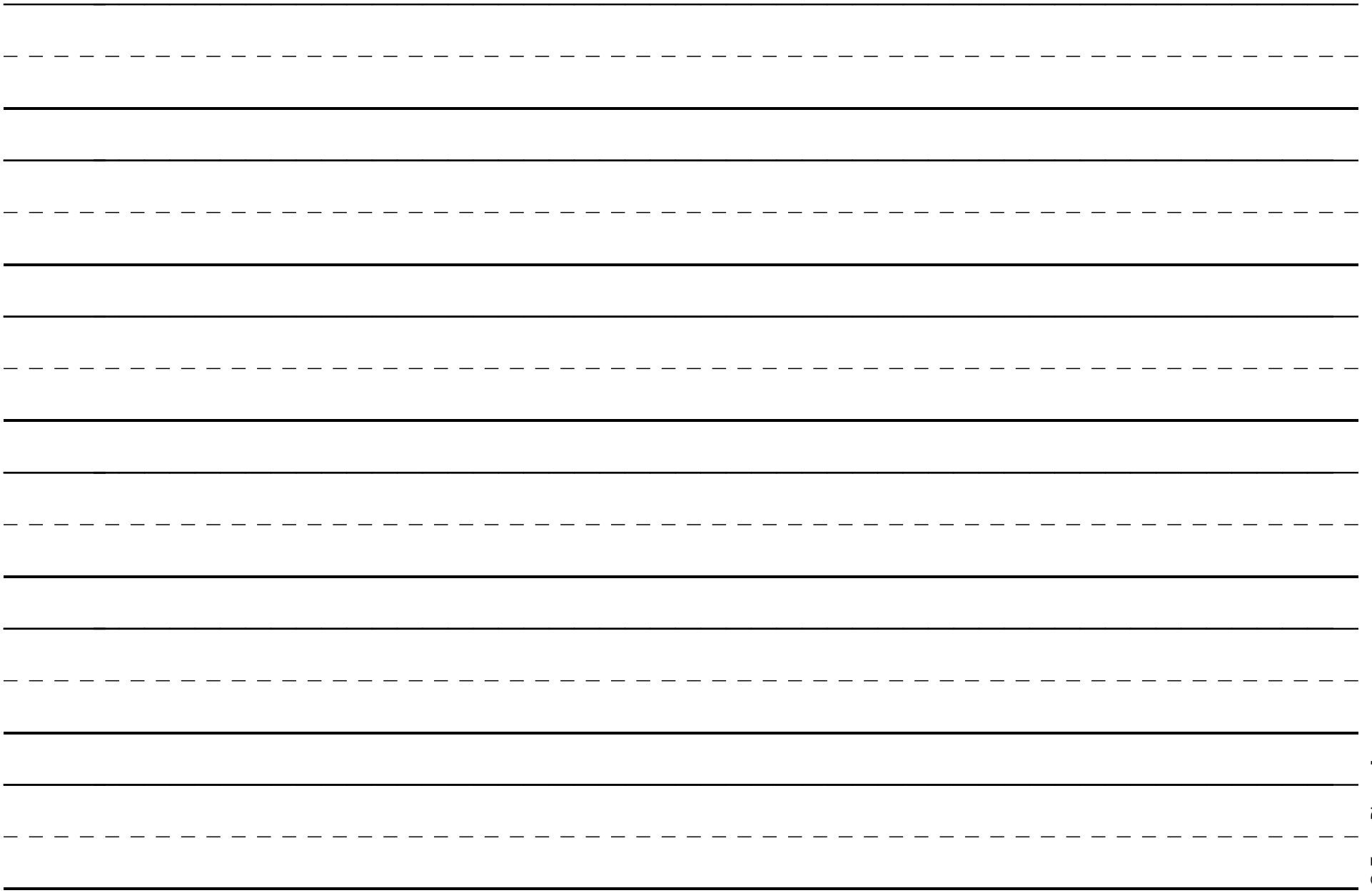

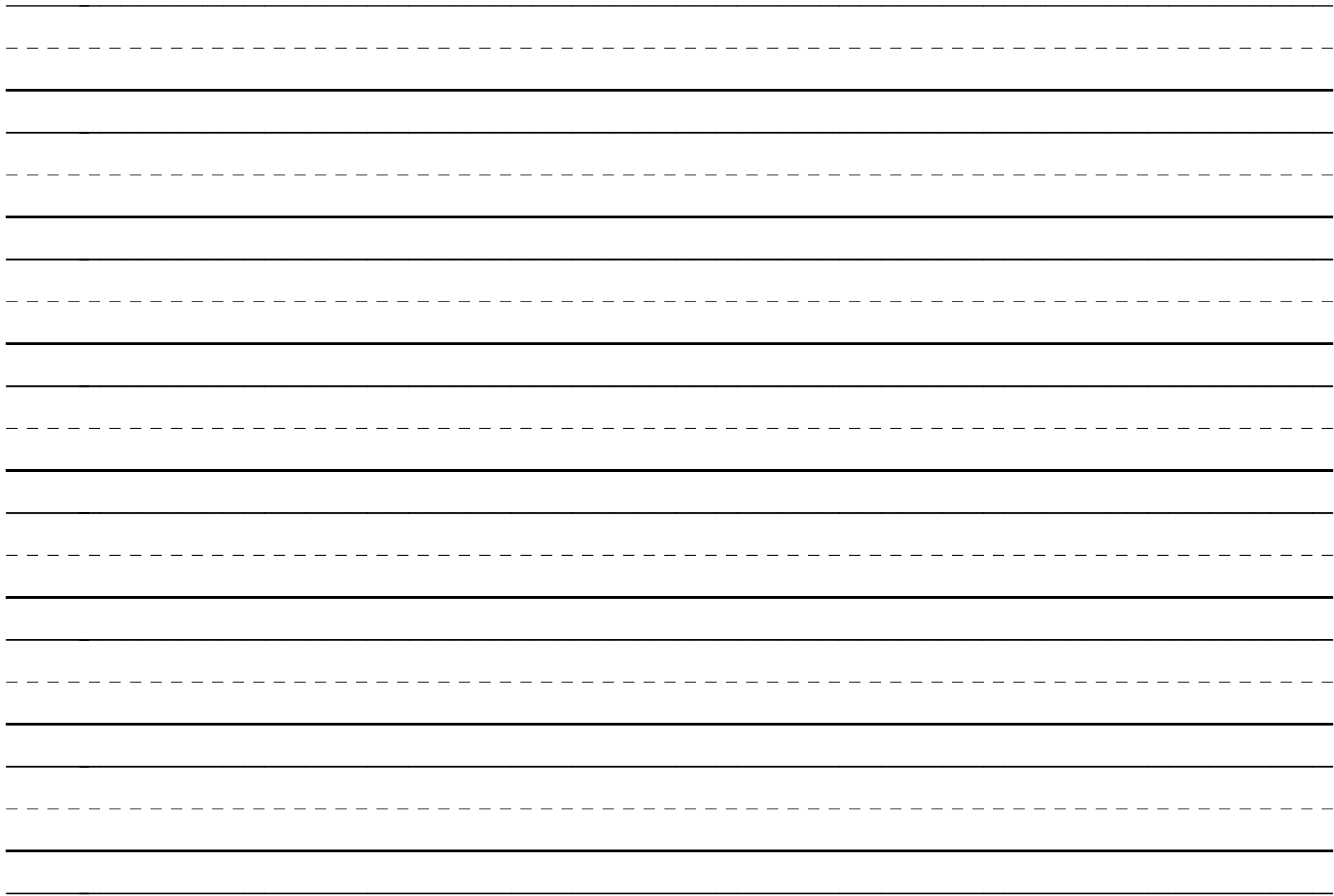
